A Letter from Transitional Pastor Roy Backus

Grace and peace be with you. Grace and peace.

Typing November 1, 2023 was jarring for me. I recognized that we are actually in November! The weather already expressed it; the trees were showing me; but typing this late autumnal date caught me off guard. Suddenly we find ourselves in the season of thankfulness for so many blessings.

When I think of all the blessings in my life, I put faces on them. It's the people who invested their lives into mine whom I remember. My parents, my siblings, pastors, teachers, and the many adopted church aunts, uncles, grandparents and friends have shaped me into who I am. It is people who shape me. Zoom and other connecting media are artificial and too often distancing. They may help in work and administration, but the personal, face to face, life changing presence of another cannot be duplicated.

This old mind of mine cannot imagine the classes at the public schools I attended or the church related college, seminaries and universities I attended, without the teachers. In all the classes, whether the subject was exciting or not, I was mentored by dedicated educators who invested their lives into their students. For me, the person who taught a course was as important as the subject they shared. Each day of November, identify one thing that you're thankful for. You can log this in a journal or a personal note, or even share it on social media, as I've seen done with the hashtag #30DaysofThanks to invite others to join you. It's a simple exercise, but simple exercises can have foundational impacts on our relationship with God.

James 1:17 says,

"Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows."

As we prepare our hearts to celebrate Thanksgiving, take the time to identify those gifts that He's given you. And while He is unchanging, we can be intentional about the changing of our perspectives. Practicing gratitude daily can make the difference between such attitudes as "Ugh, the sun is in my eyes," or "The warmth of the sun on my face feels lovely." When we exhibit perspectives of gratitude, it can be infectious - but so can negative perspectives. So the question is, which perspective would you like to spread around?

Looking ahead to this week, I'm thankful to join you at Midweek tonight! We'll also gather this Sunday from 6-8pm for Youth Group, where we'll be introducing the first of our devotional-style teachings for this semester.
