#### A Letter from Transitional Head Pastor, Roy Backus

Grace and peace be with you. Grace and peace.

Weddings are grace opportunities for the Gospel. Oh I know they are creative tangled webs of expectations, compromises, and caring for delicate emotions and feelings. They do take a great deal of energy on almost everyone's behalf. You can simply use your imagination and consider the differing participants the bride, the bride's mother, the bride's father, the groom, his parents, the bride's maids, the groom's men, flower girls, ring bearers, the instrumental musicians, the vocalists, the seating of all the relatives and friends, etc. There's just a bunch on the line. How could I possibly enjoy such an occasion, knowing that no wedding is perfect and there will always be a rub or two?

My enjoyment of weddings comes directly from the Gospel of Jesus. Each one is an opportunity to know a couple and their families and friends in a new way. I get to share several hours with them and get to lead a new set of friends and portion of the community into the church building. Such an occasion breaks the mystery of a strange building and place. Each of the new folks will be able to enter knowing somebody and what the building actually is.

Conversations, playfulness, all within the blessed awareness of faith and God's presence is pretty wonderful. The possibilities for the Lord Jesus to move within all the people present is always there. Who knows how rich a seed of the Gospel can be planted in folks who rarely think of the ultimate priorities in life. Such occasions are true gifts.

The wedding couple gets an introduction into the Gospel through 1 Corinthians 13, Paul's simple, yet profound, Spirit filled treatise on Love. Hearts and imaginations always open each time I read, *"Now remains, faith, hope and love, these three. But the greatest of these is love."* and I am reminded that faith, hope, and love, are gifts from God. Along with that reminder, I realize we talk a lot about faith and love, but we rarely nail down the meaning, and gift, of hope. This week we will converse about hope and our living and experiencing it. Our texts are Isaiah 9:1-7 and Matthew 4:12-17.
