Happy Thanksgiving! However you find yourself celebrating this week, my prayer for you is that it is a time full of joy, peace, and celebration of the ways that God has moved this year.

Last Sunday at Youth Group, we spent some time discussing the miracle of Jesus feeding the five thousand, and we looked at what we called the three C's of Jesus's provision - compassion, community, and copious blessing.
