A Letter from Transitional Head Pastor, Roy Backus

Grace and peace be with you. Grace and peace.

This is a special week for the Backus family, because my father married Dorothy Olive Thorssen, a beautiful Swedish lady. Although my father's family was spread all over the place, Mom's family stayed close in northwestern Wisconsin. I remember our family's semiannual trips to Solon Springs and the warm familial visits with grandparents, aunts, uncles, and cousins. There was comfort and joy every time we visited. That warm hospitality rubbed off on my children, and especially on my oldest daughter. In high school she was an exchange student to Sweden. Later she continued to learn Swedish, and took extra time to study our Swedish roots. A few years ago she connected with the Santa Lucia society in Chicago, and she and my youngest grandchild participate in the Santa Lucia celebration every year. (Santa Lucia Day is a Swedish festival that is celebrated on December 13th every year. It is a day to honor St. Lucy, an Italian martyr known for her compassion and generous nature. It includes crowing of the maiden to lead the procession from the Swedish American Museum to Ebenezer Lutheran Church. The church setting is perfect to gain the Advent Season Spirit, and the music, dance, loving environment and celebration of faith and family is just right. My daughter has truly brought me in closer contact with our heritage. So, although I'll miss First Presbyterian's Wednesday night celebration of cookies and carols, I will be celebrating with you and my family at the same time.
