#### A letter from Transitional Head Pastor Roy Backus

A letter from Director of Children and Youth Ministries, Lindsay Gordon

### Hello everyone!

I hope this message finds you all nice and warm somewhere! I'm one of those people who would much rather be hot than cold, so these past couple of weeks have not been the most fun. But I'm thankful that we're back up in the double digits, and hopefully it stays that way!

Last week at Midweek, we had a fun conversation with the kids about miracles during our lesson, titled "Jesus is amazing!" Part of that conversation was focusing on the miracles that we don't realize are happening all the time - such as our hearts beating, our brains containing billions of synapses constantly communicating with each other, and our lungs constantly refilling themselves without us even needing to think about it.
