A letter from Transitional Head Pastor Roy Backus

Grace and peace, be with you. Grace and peace.

It's my hope that we all realize that, the number one reason people accept Christ, is because they know a Christian. AND the number one reason people do not come to know Christ, is because they know a Christian. Note, I did not say that "the number one reason people do not become Church Members is because . . ." That may be true, but our mandate is to bring people to Christ, not necessarily bring them to church. (Maybe this is another example of the former statement as a Shall statement, and latter statement as an Is Appropriate Statement!)

We are called to share the Good News of our Lord. The Apostle Paul knew and practiced sharing the life-giving message of our Savior. This week, we will see how great and grand our Lord really is. Isaiah's message in Isaiah 40 portrays our Lord as the all powerful creator and care giver. We will see how reliant we are upon him, and how graceful he is towards us. The story of Jesus' healings in Capernaum will remind us of our Lord's ministry and in a round about fashion state the goal of all people. We will discuss these two essential passages of God's Word, Isaiah 40 and Mark 1:29-39. In addition you could read companion passages of 1 Corinthians 9 and Psalm 147.

Hello everyone!

What a wonderful Sunday full of all kinds of celebrations! I was so grateful to be able to share in that joy with all of you. Thank you so much for your warm reception towards me and all of the new members, elders, and deacons.

It's hard to believe that we are already a month into 2024. Maybe at this point in the year, some of the "new car smell" has worn off - what once seemed new and exciting maybe feels a little mundane. Maybe resolutions have already been abandoned, or maybe it feels difficult to enjoy the newness of the year in the midst of the cold and rain. It's easy for exhaustion, or even burnout, to feel like it's beginning to creep in, even only a month into the year. And it's even easier to feel like we have to power through on our own strength.

I was given a reminder this week of where our source of strength comes from, when Isaiah 40:31 came up in my devotional reading: "but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. "I was glad when they said unto me, Let us go into the house of the Lord." Psalm 122:1

Two weeks ago in my sermon I mentioned the interaction between a pastor and a Christmas - Easter church goer. When the pastor asked the man to be more active and show up to church in between those high holidays, to 'be active in the Lord's Army', the man responded "I am in the Secret Service".

That little story got me thinking and praying on it the last two weeks. In part because it warms my heart to see people excited and involved in the life of the church. Also because I know, not just from experience but also from the Bible and the church's witness over the many years, that faith grows when the people of God come and do the things of God. You might have heard me speak about the "Individualistic faith" that seems to describe our western approach to faith.
