A letter from Transitional Head Pastor Roy Backus

Grace and peace be with you. Grace and peace.

Too often we complicate life. This to especially true when it comes to church and religious practices. Years ago I read a "textlike" theology book titled, "A Quest for Vitality in Religion." Years later I discovered the author was a Southern Baptist professor at the Southern Baptist Seminary in Louisville, KY. He wrote under a pseudo name, because he would be attacked for his positions on theology and the cycles of church life. (The book opened many new avenues of thoughtful faith to me.)

The flow of the book traced an established faith empowered by a spiritual leader and the new insights and energy of his/her vision instilled, through experience, in the first generation of disciples. Then the second generation of disciples (usually raised in the faith), has to establish practices to re-establish the continued practices of the faith, and the loyal practice. The third generation brings questions of the practices and meanings. By the fourth generation there is a disengagement between the foundations of the original generation of disciple experience and the present practice of tradition. Through the practice of the established norms of worship, the beliefs grow distant from the early generations. The present practitioners do not have the immediate experience of the early generations. In quick order, the faith tradition will become brittle and unable to continue and shrink to fit only those who practice with a sense of necessity to the past traditional loyalty.

This has happened in religious communities in all traditions all over the world. This death of vitality continues, unless there is a new awakening in the present, isolated generation. A newness of religious experience and a new vitality of discovery and meaning can happen in the new generation with visionary leaders who translate the original beliefs, truths, experiences from dead history to living experience in the present. It rarely happens, but it can through faith and commitment.

These last few weeks I've been reminded that 1st Pres., Joliet, will never be the church that it once was. Only the present disciples can create a new vitality of what this church can become. A renewal can only come from your hearts to bring the new, necessary vitality to the present.

This week, our central lesson is in the Gospel of John, Chapter 10, verses 24 through 30. Read the entire chapter and be reminded of our Lord's commitment to care for us for eternity. It's my daily prayer that we live in the warmth and vitality of his call.
