A letter from Associate Pastor Bo Mircea

**Psalm 91:2** "You ...will say to the Lord, 'My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust.' "

I was thinking about faith this past week, and the many aspects of it. I am convinced that faith has many layers, from that mustard seed to faith that moves mountains, from a widow's mite to Lidia and her giving heart towards Paul and his ministry. Faith is sometimes passive, waiting for the water of the word to speak up. Faith sometimes is active, taking us outside our comfort zone. With all these thoughts about faith, once thing was impressed on my heart: When and how do we speak faith? Do we start in our confessions? Do we do it in our prayers? Or in our conversations? Or do we not at all?

Sometimes it is so refreshing to run into someone that has a strong faith, and before I get to say anything to encourage them, they already pour their faith into me. Like I am here to visit you in the hospital, and pray with you and not the other way around... But that is what faith does. It bubbles, it grows, and it speaks. I pray today that your faith will speak loud, from the silence of your prayer room to the mountaintops, sharing the good news of Christ.

One more thing: Life Group continues to meet on Sunday morning. As a matter of fact there will be a bigger table in Hoffman Hall with more chairs and room for anyone who wants to join us for interesting, sometimes deep, and sometimes personal conversation on faith and life.
