John 12:12-16. 'The next day the great crowd that had come to the festival heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord—the King of Israel!" '

Palm Sunday carries so much meaning in our faith. In part because we associate the day with celebration, with the triumphant entry in to the city of David, of seeing Jesus as a King, surrounded and loved by multitudes. I do love that picture, but what I love even more is the sounds of the crowd, the noise, the celebration, and the yelling. 'Hosanna, Lord save us' sometimes gets lost in our culture, where we associate Hosanna with praise, with celebration, and not the dependency on God, with that cry of 'Lord I need you'. Yes, Palm Sunday is a day of celebration, but it is also a day for us to remember that salvation is at hand, that who we are will always be in connection to Jesus. He is the King! This Sunday let us celebrate the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords! Come, Lord Jesus, Come!

Hello everybody!

There is so much to anticipate as we approach this weekend, with the Easter Egg Hunt and Holy Week right around the corner. It would be perfectly understandable to feel a little overwhelmed by it all - after all, there is quite a lot on the calendar! I myself try really hard to not get lost in it all, as Holy Week is one of my favorite times of the year.

I was reminded of a word that I try to be very intentional about by observing my dog, Rocket, this week. Today is his first "Gotcha Day" - one year ago today, my husband and I brought him home from the animal rescue! I, of course, want to celebrate and spoil him with special treats, so I got him a dog bakery treat from Pet Supplies Plus. The treat itself is massive - it probably would give Rocket a belly ache if I let him chow down on the whole thing, as much as he would like to try. So, I broke it up into a few pieces, so that Rocket can *savor* his Gotcha Day treat over a few days of celebration instead.
