Psalm 46

God's Defense of His City and People

1 God is our refuge and strength,
a very present help in trouble.
2 Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change,
though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea,
3 though its waters roar and foam,
though the mountains tremble with its tumult.

This coming Sunday, we will look at "A Mighty Fortress is our God" by Martin Luther, as the conversation hymn in our summer series on hymns that changed the Christian faith, and the church along the way. Without giving away too much of my Sunday sermon, I want to encourage you to meditate on those first three verses from Psalm 46, while asking the question: What is trouble in the context of this Psalm? What do I understand when someone says to me: I am in trouble? And one last question: Is there such a thing as Big Trouble or Small Trouble?

My prayer for us as a congregation continues to be along the lines of: Lord, help us in being faithful to you, and while we ask for your protection from the evil one, let us not be afraid to cause "good trouble" though the work of our hands.

I am looking forward to sharing with you the Hope of the Gospel this coming Sunday.

# **ACOLYTE**

If you would like for your child(ren) to help serve Jesus Christ and His church by being an Acolyte during Sunday morning services, please send an email to Worship Council Member, Sarah Randolph at music.randolph@firstpresjoliet.org. Sarah will then contact you to show you where things are and how to place items.

The Acolyte would need to arrive at church by 9:50 am. Guardians need to help the Acolyte light the 2 candles on the communion table, then take the battery operated "Christ Candle" to the Narthex and wait for the first hymn, then carry the Christ Candle to the communion table. The Acolyte should then sit up front by the Pastor until the Children's sermon. After the Children's sermon, the Acolyte will go to Sunday School or sit with family.

The word acolyte is derived from the Greek word akolouthos, meaning companion, attendant, or helper, who waits continually upon another: a follower. The Acolyte ministry has its roots in the Old Testament of the Holy Bible, where the prophet Samuel is seen assisting Eli, the Levite priest, and Elisha is seen assisting Elijah the Prophet.

Why do we have candles and acolytes?

The lighting of the communion table candles in the worship service is a symbol of Jesus coming into the presence of the worshiping community. Just as the Israelites were led through the desert by a pillar of fire, we are led by Christ, the light of the world. To acolyte at worship is to bring: Celebration, Reverence, Anticipation of Christ's return. In short, the Acolyte sets the visual table for worship. The Acolyte brings the light of Christ to start worship and leads the light of Christ out before the congregation leaves to serve Jesus Christ.
