Presbyterian Disaster Assistance

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance enables congregations and partners of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A) to witness to the healing love of Christ through caring for communities adversely affected by crisis and catastrophic events.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is the emergency and refugee program of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. The core budget, including staff and administrative costs, is funded through the One Great Hour of Sharing, and its program work is additionally funded through designated gifts.

How do we help?

If you go to the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PCUSA) you are welcomed by these words: OUT OF CHAOS, HOPE!

What a great vision to be part of, and to realize that even in doing something small you can make a whole lot of difference in someone's life. Being part of PCUSA, we become part of the Greater Ministry of the Church, doing and being part of work that goes beyond the simplicity of sending a check here or there. By partnering with PDA, First Pres becomes an important and strategic partner in providing assistance not just as the first responders enter an emergency, but also for the following stages of ministry and reconstruction as communities are being rebuilt and life settles into that new normal post disaster.

It is because of the country wide fellowship of the church that PDA can be present in so many places at the same time, and being there to effectively serve and respond even in the first days of response.

This is the case, again, for the flooding in Texas. While we will never be able to understand the pain that has stroked so many families from the areas affected, we surely can pray and in a small part participate in the effort that takes place as so many organizations are trying to bring life to the effected areas.

And while we might never know how we make a difference, we should always remember that Hope comes in many ways, sometimes in the least expected ways.

Holy One, you are our comfort and strength in times of sudden disaster, crisis, or chaos. Surround us now with your grace and peace through storm or earthquake, fire or flood.
