Siloam Eye Hospital



Siloam Eye Hospital is a Korean medical institution founded by the grace of God. It is a hospital devoted to medical missions work. Following Christ's example of love and healing, the Siloam Eye Hospital aims to bring Light—through free eye treatment, blindness prevention, and eyesight-recovery operations—to those suffering at home (in Korea) and abroad.

"At the age of ten, I lost both my eyes and my parents due to the Korean War. Becoming orphaned and blind brought many challenges, but by God's grace and the help of an American Presbyterian missionary, I was able to study in a regular school and become a pastor." - Rev Sun-Tae Kim, Director of Siloam Eye Hospital

The Siloam Eye Hospital was founded in 1986 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Christianity's advent into Korea. A hospital devoted to treating every patient as one would a family member. A hospital striving for holistic healing—one that not only illuminates the physical eyes of patients, but also the mental and spiritual as well. A hospital dedicated to providing the state-of-the-art medical services in an optimal environment.
