MISSION OF THE MONTH

MorningStar Mission



MorningStar Mission is a non-denominational organization dedicated to relieving the spiritual and physical hunger of the poor by providing food for the hungry, clothes for the needy, shelter for the homeless and the gospel of Jesus Christ for all.

Through their many Christ-centered programs and services, they aim to help people in need by getting to the core issues of what has caused their homelessness. Whether the problem stems from alcohol, drugs, mental health or family matters, their services have been developed for those who have reached the decision to make a real change in their lives.

FOOD: MorningStar operates the East Side Cafe which serves a full nutritious breakfast, lunch, and dinner for everyone who comes in, as well as a Friday Food Pantry.

SHELTER: A Men and Women's Emergency Shelter is operable 7 days a week/365 days a year. MorningStar runs a Women and Family Center and assists with transitional housing.

RECOVERY: Their Men's 180 Residential Recovery Program serves to help those seeking to break from chronic homelessness and addiction. Graduates can be a part of the Hope House transitional housing program.

RESOURCES: MorningStar Mission hosts the New Day Drop-In center which provides resources and services, such as computers, referrals, and telephones for those experiencing homelessness.

THRIFT STORES: MorningStar Treasure Chest is the local thrift store where MorningStar provides vouchers for those in need to be able to acquire clothes, furniture etc.

Over the years you could find our volunteers helping cook and serve on Saturday mornings at the cafe, renovate and paint the Men's Shelter, or raising funds so the dream of a Women and Family Shelter would become a reality. While ministry over the years has changed, MorningStar Mission is still in our heart at Christmas time as we participate in the Stars of Hope program where numerous children get new clothing and a special gift for Christmas. MorningStar Mission is indeed a ministry of hope that we are so happy to partner with.

Lord God, we call on you as father to the fatherless, mother to the motherless, one that is always close to those in need. Feeling at Home with Vivian Pritz Helwich

As a lifelong member of the Joliet community, First Pres has always been a part of my life. I was baptized, confirmed, and married my husband, Tom, here. I absolutely love this church as it has created an environment of love and holds a true sense of family to where my husband and now children have been accepted with open arms.

Growing up, I was a member of the Youth Group and enjoyed going on mission trips. Two memorable trips were to New York City and Washington D.C. where we delivered food, mowed people's lawns, and visited homeless shelters. On the New York City trip, I was a Senior in High School. We slept on air mattresses and I had the best time not only working with fellow Christians but getting to know myself. There was an incident with my air mattress, when we came back from working all day. There was a leak in the ceiling and water covered the entire air mattress. It was a funny reminder of such a bigger picture of what I was learning that week. Our mission week focused on feeding the homeless. I realized that having a soggy mattress was nothing compared to various challenges others face. Thinking of others, being grateful, and spreading kindness are not only gestures or characteristics but help when making genuine connections with others.

Through these experiences, and several others like this, First Pres. helped shape me into the person that I am today. I've created lasting memories serving as a Youth Group Leader, participating in Trunk and Treat, volunteering for events;

and more recently, serving on Growth Council.

My husband and I love experiencing First Pres through our children's eyes. Collin and Isla get so excited on Sundays. They love seeing Pastor Bo, and it is wonderful to see him be a part of the important events in their lives. They love the Soar High Program, and we can't say enough good things about it. All of the leaders Sarah Randolph, Kaleigh Belfield, and Pastor Bo are consistent positive influences in their lives. It is those special connections that have made being a part of First Pres such a meaningful experience.

At our wedding, we used candles that my grandfather had made for church. When my nephew, Ryan Jeffrey Pritz, was baptized, Pastor Bo included the hymn "I Danced in the Morning," in the service because he knew that it had special meaning for the Pritz family. Often, Pastor Bo somehow knows what I've been going through the previous week; and in his sermons, he seems to be talking

directly to me.

First Pres has always been and will continue to be part of my family. I'm eager to watch our children grow and thrive within our beloved church and create lasting memories as well.
