Volunteers of America's Hope Manor

Hope Manor Joliet is one of the first large scale, supportive housing developments specifically designed for Veterans with families. The need for services to all Veterans struggling with unemployment, mental health challenges and homelessness continues to grow. Hope Manor Joliet provides a comprehensive response to the challenges facing all Veterans who are homeless or at-risk of homelessness – especially female Veterans and Veterans with children. Hope Manor Joliet is a campus-style community that provides a flexible continuum of housing and supportive services to individual Veterans and Veterans with families through unique combination units.

As the name implies, Hope Manor Joliet is about much more than simply providing housing for Veterans who are struggling – the goal is to help Veterans change and improve their lives over the long-term by promoting self-sufficiency, building new skills, creating strong support networks and integrating Veterans more positively into community life.

Residents live in fully furnished units, there are community resource centers with access to computers and a library as well as a playground, and program events and activities.

How do we help?

Working together our Mission Council and Oasis Women's Ministry will be collecting donations for the residents at Hope Manor. The items requested are everyday necessities such as: toilet paper, Kleenex, paper towels, toothpaste, mouthwash, body wash, lotions, deodorant, candy/chocolate, and snacks (chips, granola bars, breakfast bars, crackers, fruit rollups). You can drop off these items at the church until December 17th. Our support of this mission comes, in part, in honor of longtime friend of First Pres. Kevin Breitbarth who found support and a home at Hope Manor. Thank you for your contributions and loving support.

Making Music at First Pres with Ken and Karen Myers

Over 60 years ago, at the First Christian Church in Torrance, CA, there was a tenor sitting next to a soprano in the youth choir. The tenor's father was the youth minister and the soprano's father, the senior choir director. Their friendship evolved into the currently 58-year marriage of Ken and Karen Myers. Ken is the oldest of three boys, and Karen has a younger brother. They have two daughters, two sons-in-law, four grandchildren, two cats and a sheltie dog.

They moved to Illinois 39 years ago from Dansville, a small town in western New York. Ken had taught music at Canandaigua and Dansville public schools at the Jr and Sr high levels for 17 years. He had served several churches in upstate New York for over 20 years including the Dansville Presbyterian Church for 11 years. Karen sang in those choirs too and loved being a part of those church families. Karen had also worked as an administrative assistant for Instructor Magazine and SUNY Geneseo. They both had participated in a community theatre group which each year put on productions that helped to fund the summer youth theatre program that both their daughters enjoyed. Music has been a constant force in their lives together.

When they moved to Naperville, Ken worked in Chicago and later served as choir director for Knox Presbyterian Church. Karen sang at Knox too and also worked for a local attorney, and together they put two kids through college. They moved to the Joliet area 21 years ago to be closer to their daughters who were both living there and attending First Pres. with their families.

When Ken and Karen started attending First Pres, they felt at home enjoying the music of the choir, and bell choir as well as the beautiful pipe organ being expertly played by Bev Adelmann. They also got to know more members and grew into a new church family. That first summer, Ken had the opportunity to direct the Summer Choir in place of the retiring director, Linda Haeger. Soon after, he applied for the position and was hired by Session.

They both are proud to belong to such a beautiful, loving church. They love the people and the choir family. Karen is an Elder having served on Worship Council. She loves decorating the church, making it inviting for members and visitors to attend. She has also helped distribute food at St. Johns Food Pantry. Ken enjoys working with the choir, Beth, and Bev to make the music come alive.

Through the years, they've watched their grandchildren grow up in the First Pres. family being involved in all of the choirs, the musicals, children's worship, youth groups, and mission trips. There are too many memories to count, but they have loved the few times their family has sung together as one group, and they always look forward to the Christmas Eve service.

Being a church musician is a unique experience that is felt with everyone around you as you sing from your heart to worship and praise God. Ken and Karen have experienced a lifetime of making music and worshipping God. Ken says, "Being a part of a church choir is an opportunity to grow together to share God's word in one collective voice."
