MISSION OF THE MONTH

Grief and Care Packages for Bereaved Parents

I am reaching out to share our November mission project, a heartfelt initiative dedicated to supporting parents who have recently experienced the profound loss of a child in the hospital. Our goal is to assemble and deliver grief and care packages that offer comfort, hope, and practical support during their time of unimaginable sorrow. When Ezequiel and I lost our twin boys in the hospital, the care packages that we received were everything that we didn't know we needed and helped us very much.

This mission involves preparing thoughtful packages for mothers and fathers grieving the loss of their child. Each package will contain items designed to provide gentle care and solace, such as handwritten notes, devotional booklets, comfort items (like blankets and candles), and resources for emotional and spiritual healing. We will work in partnership with Saint Joe's Hospital to ensure these packages reach families most in need, letting them know they are seen, loved, and not alone.

The impact of this project will ripple throughout our community in several meaningful ways. First, it offers direct support to grieving parents, helping them find hope and healing. It strengthens our congregation's commitment to compassion and service, demonstrating the love of Christ in action. This will also create a bridge between our church and the wider community, inviting others to participate in acts of mercy and empathy during difficult times.

This mission is one in which everyone can play a part. Over the next couple of weeks, we invite individuals and families to contribute items for the packages, such as devotional materials, journals, plush comforts, or tea. Whether you contribute an item, your time, or your prayers, your involvement will help us bring light to those in their darkest hours.

Heavenly Father, We come to You with humble hearts, asking for Your comfort, peace, and presence to surround families who are grieving the loss of a child.
